- Assessing or assessment process experience (eg assessing knowledge and understanding within courses in the sector such as face to face or remote delivery of animal training/behaviour courses).
- Is able to commit to at least 6 hours per week (average over a month period) to this role alongside any other work/employment commitments.
- Organised with a strong attention to detail.
- Flexibility in their availability throughout the year to deal with the submission windows throughout the calendar.
- Supports the goals of the ABTC
- Able to complete work according to required due dates and be able to motivate Assessors to do the same
- Can work independently and as part of a team
- Excellent inter-personal skills
- Is able to carry out work without bias and with total confidentiality
- Experience of chairing committee
